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developments arising out of the global pandemic and how they have impacted mediation are also addressed.

**Mediation Skills and Strategies:** Key mediation skills and interventions will be demonstrated and applied in this unit using online interactive role-play simulation and expert practitioner input. The role of solicitors, barrister and other participants in mediation will also be explored.

This Unit offers a practical guide to the recent legislation and case law, with a particular emphasis on the role of the court in mediation.

This lecture will look at the functions and duties of the Tribunal to include membership and the recruitment process, when and where the Tribunal sits, the different types of cases brought before the Tribunal, documentation and submissions and the decisions of the Tribunal.		
<b>2 Equality, human rights and inclusion:</b> A look at the functions of the Irish Human Rights and Equality Commission with respect to the protection and promotion of human rights and equality.
