Lecture 2: Data protection issues:

Charities and data protection, categories of personal data; advent of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR); life cycle of information; evolution of current Data Protection Act (DPA) to GDPR; GDPR terminology: 'fair', 'lawful', 'transparent'; processing special categories of data; some basics of governance; Article 35: Data Protection Officer; segregation of duties; Subject access requests and charities; DPC's Code of Practice for Charities; anatomy of a charity data breach; data sharing with public sector bodies; technology and cross border data transfers; consent in the GDP; new definition of consent criteria; GDPR and children; direct marketing rules; marketing to existing customers/ donors; cookies and location.

Lecture 3: Essentials of Volunteer Engagement:

Definition of volunteering; volunteer management cycle; involving volunteers; organisational philosophy; organisational policy; volunteer policy; volunteer vs. paid staff dynamic; managing volunteers; managing expectations; volunteer orientation and induction; volunteer support and supervision.

Lecture 4: Procurement & Tendering: (Online Release)

Context: European law and Irish law; procurement and tendering rules; relevant contracts; below-threshold contracts; partially-covered contracts; fully covered aspects; advertising; open procedure; restricted procedure; negotiated/ competitive dialogue; frameworks and dynamic purchasing; modifications to contracts; strategic aspects of procurement; value-formoney considerations; social and environmental factors; market knowledge.
