Information on Course Format

Section (2A)(d) of the Solicitors Act 1954 as inserted by section 2 of the Legal Practitioners (Irish Language) Act 2008 requires the Law Society of Ireland to provide an "...advanced course for the practice of law through the Irish language as an optional subject for those pursuing the Professional Practice Course". Section (2A)(e) states "The advanced course may, in addition to being an optional subject in the Professional Practice Course, be made available to such other persons as the Society shall determine from time to time, including but not limited to solicitors who wish to develop or retain a level of competence to practise through the Irish language." Attendance and Course Engagement Requirements

- This is a blended learning course. It combines traditional lecture/workshop class contact sessions with online engagement through the Law School's virtual learning environment, Moodle.
- In between biweekly sessions (outlined below), participants must complete online course work on an individual or group basis.
- In order to be deemed to have successfully passed the course, all course participants must meet all course attendance and continuous assessment requirements, which includes multiple task completion.
- Online engagement will include attending live sessions, viewing lecture videos, completing online tasks (e.g. grammar exercises), uploading/downloading of files, word processing, among others.
- Physical engagement will comprise attendance at lectures and workshops. These will occur at the Education Centre, Law Society of Ireland, Blackhall Place, Dublin 7 unless otherwise indicated.

Technology

- It is **strongly** recommended that course participants have a good level of IT skills and their own personal computer/laptop or tablet. Course live lectures and workshops will be facilitated via Zoom.
- If using personal computing equipment, course participants will need Javascript enabled, and if possible Adobe Flash installed (except for iPad/iPhone). Some corporate firewalls might block the lecture videos and other features of the Moodle virtual learning environment. It is recommended that participants consult with their IT departments in their firms if they intend on completing coursework in the office.
