## USE OF LAW SOCIETY SUITE OF PARTNERSHIP PRECEDENTS

- 1. These are precedents and not model or standard contracts. The provisions are offered as a starting point for discussions but must be adapted to the circumstances of each case.
- 2. These precedents are intended for use in connection with smaller partnerships of solicitors only.
- 3. Certain footnotes have been added to clauses but they are not intended as full drafting notes
- 4. Appropriate external professional advice should be obtained by those using these precedents.
- 5. These precedents do not deal with persons who are held out as partners but who are not in fact owners of the business. A solicitor (whether known as a salaried partner or otherwise) that is held out as a partner may have joint lability (and in certain circumstances, joint and several liability) as a partner and will be treated as a full partner by the Law Society for regulatory purposes.
  - A specific agreement will be required between such a solicitor and the partnership.
